Rural Broadband

CERB is authorized to make rural broadband loans to finance the cost to build infrastructure to provide high-speed, open-access broadband service to rural and underserved communities, for the purpose of community and economic development.







Eligible Jurisdictions

- Cities & Towns
- Counties
- Federally Recognized Tribes
- Municipal and Quasi-Municipal Corporations
- Port Districts
- Special Purpose Districts (e.g. PDAs, PUDs)





Purpose

For projects that encourage, foster, develop, and improve broadband within the state in order to:

- Drive job creation, promote innovation, and expand markets for local businesses; or
- Serve the ongoing and growing needs of local education systems, health care systems, public safety systems, industries and businesses, governmental operations, and citizens; and
- Improve accessibility for underserved communities and populations.





Timeline

- March 2018 Budget Passed
- March April 2018 Staff worked with CERB Policy Committee and conducted stakeholder outreach to develop program policies, procedures, and materials.
- May 17, 2018 CERB approved the program policies, procedures, and materials.
- June 2018 Staff hosted 6 Rural Broadband Workshops
- across the State.
- July 2018 Received the 1st round of applications.
- September 2018 CERB approved the 1st round of applications.





Increased Avg of 21 **NEW ISPs**










