1 WHEREAS, It is of paramount importance to establish cutoff dates
2 for the consideration of legislation during the 1992 Regular Session of
3 the Fifty-Second Legislature;

4 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of
5 the State of Washington, the Senate concurring, That the following
6 cutoff dates shall apply to all bills, memorials, and joint resolutions
7 with the exception of matters relating to initiatives and alternatives
8 to initiatives, health care reform, education reform consistent with
9 the work of the Governor's council on education reform and funding,
10 juvenile justice task force recommendations, and budgets and matters
11 necessary to implement budgets:

12 Friday, February 7, 1992, the twenty-sixth day, shall be the final
13 day to read in committee reports in the house of origin with the
14 exception of reports from the Senate Ways and Means, Senate
15 Transportation, and House fiscal committees;

1 Tuesday, February 11, 1992, the thirtieth day, shall be the final
2 day to read in Senate Ways and Means, Senate Transportation, and House
3 fiscal committee reports in the house of origin;

4 Tuesday, February 18, 1992, the thirty-seventh day, at 5:00 p.m.,
5 shall be the final time to consider bills in their house of origin;

6 Friday, February 28, 1992, the forty-seventh day, shall be the
7 final day to read in committee reports on bills from the opposite house
8 with the exception of reports from the Senate Ways and Means, Senate
9 Transportation, and House fiscal committees;

10 Monday, March 2, 1992, the fiftieth day, shall be the final day to
11 read in Senate Ways and Means, Senate Transportation, and House fiscal
12 committee reports on bills from the opposite house; and

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That after 5:00 p.m. on Friday, March 6,
14 1992, the fifty-fourth day, neither house may consider any bills,
15 memorials, or joint resolutions except messages pertaining to
16 amendments, matters of differences between the two houses, conference
17 reports, and matters incident to the interim and to the closing of the
18 business of the 1992 Regular Session of the Legislature.
