1 AN ACT Relating to requiring community networks to emphasize youth
2 job training and employment; and amending RCW 70.190.050, 70.190.070,
3 70.190.080, and 43.41.195.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.190.050 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 207 are each amended
6 to read as follows:

7 (1) The Washington state institute for public policy shall conduct
8 or contract for monitoring and tracking of the implementation of
9 chapter 7, Laws of 1994 sp. sess. to determine whether these efforts
10 result in a measurable reduction of violence. The institute shall also
11 conduct or contract for an evaluation of the effectiveness of the
12 community public health and safety networks in reducing the rate of at-
13 risk youth through reducing risk factors ((and)), increasing protective
14 factors, and increasing youth job readiness and employment
15 opportunities. The evaluation plan shall result in statistically valid
16 evaluation at both state-wide and community levels. The evaluation
17 plan shall be submitted to the governor and appropriate legislative
18 committees by July 1, 1995.

1 (2) Starting five years after the initial grant to a community
2 network, if the community network fails to meet the outcome standards
3 and goals in any two consecutive years, the institute shall make
4 recommendations to the legislature concerning whether the funds
5 received by that community network should revert back to the
6 originating agency. In making this determination, the institute shall
7 consider the adequacy of the level of intervention relative to the risk
8 factors in the community and any external events having a significant
9 impact on risk factors or outcomes.

10 (3) The outcomes required under this chapter ~~((and)), and the~~
11 outcome evaluation of the community networks, shall be based on, but
12 not limited to, social development standards and measures established
13 by the department of health under RCW 43.70.555 ~~((shall be used in~~
14 ~~conducting the outcome evaluation of the community networks))~~.

15 **Sec. 2.** RCW 70.190.070 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 304 are each amended
16 to read as follows:

17 The community public health and safety networks shall:

18 (1) Review state and local public health data and analysis relating
19 to risk factors, protective factors, and at-risk children and youth;

20 (2) Prioritize the risk factors and protective factors to reduce
21 the likelihood of their children and youth being at risk. The
22 priorities shall be based upon public health data and assessment and
23 policy development standards provided by the department of health under
24 RCW 43.70.555;

25 (3) Develop long-term comprehensive plans to reduce the rate of at-
26 risk children and youth; ~~((set))~~ and increase the job readiness and
27 employment opportunities for at-risk youth. The plans shall include
28 definitive, measurable goals, based ~~((upon))~~ on relevant factors,
29 including, but not limited to, the department of health standards; and
30 ~~((project their desired))~~ projected outcomes;

31 (4) ~~((Distribute funds to local programs that reflect the locally~~
32 ~~established priorities and as provided in RCW 70.190.140;))~~ Distribute
33 (a) funds to local programs that reflect the locally established
34 priorities; and (b) twenty-five percent of available funds for programs
35 provided for under RCW 70.190.080(3);

36 (5) Comply with outcome-based standards;

37 (6) Cooperate with the department of health and local boards of
38 health to provide data and determine outcomes; and

1 (7) Coordinate its efforts with anti-drug use efforts and
2 organizations and maintain a high priority for combatting drug use by
3 at-risk youth.

4 **Sec. 3.** RCW 70.190.080 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 305 are each amended
5 to read as follows:

6 (1) The community network's plan may include a program to provide
7 postsecondary scholarships to at-risk students who: (a) Are community
8 role models under criteria established by the community network; (b)
9 successfully complete high school; and (c) maintain at least a 2.5
10 grade point average throughout high school. Funding for the
11 scholarships may include public and private sources.

12 (2) The community network's plan may also include funding of
13 community-based home visitor programs which are designed to reduce the
14 incidence of child abuse and neglect (~~(with [within])~~) within the
15 network. Parents shall sign a voluntary authorization for services,
16 which may be withdrawn at any time. The program may provide parents
17 with education and support either in parents' homes or in other
18 locations comfortable for parents, beginning with the birth of their
19 first baby. The program may make the following services available to
20 the families:

21 (a) Visits for all expectant or new parents, either at the parent's
22 home or another location with which the parent is comfortable;

23 (b) Screening before or soon after the birth of a child to assess
24 the family's strengths and goals and define areas of concern in
25 consultation with the family;

26 (c) Parenting education and skills development;

27 (d) Parenting and family support information and referral;

28 (e) Parent support groups; and

29 (f) Service coordination for individual families, and assistance
30 with accessing services, provided in a manner that ensures that
31 individual families have only one individual or agency to which they
32 look for service coordination. Where appropriate for a family, service
33 coordination may be conducted through interdisciplinary or interagency
34 teams.

35 These programs are intended to be voluntary for the parents
36 involved.

37 (3) The community network (~~(may)~~) shall include funding of:

1 (a) At-risk youth job placement and training programs. The
2 programs shall:

3 (i) Identify and recruit at-risk youth for local job opportunities;

4 (ii) Provide skills and needs assessments for each youth recruited;

5 (iii) Provide career and occupational counseling to each youth
6 recruited;

7 (iv) Identify businesses willing to provide employment and training
8 opportunities for at-risk youth;

9 (v) Match each youth recruited with a business that meets his or
10 her skills and training needs;

11 (vi) Provide employment and training opportunities that prepare the
12 individual for demand occupations; and

13 (vii) Include, to the extent possible, collaboration of business,
14 labor, education and training, community organizations, and local
15 government;

16 (b) Employment assistance, including job development, school-to-
17 work placement, employment readiness training, basic skills,
18 apprenticeships, job mentoring, and private sector and community
19 service employment;

20 (c) Education assistance, including tutoring, mentoring,
21 interactions with role models, entrepreneurial education and projects,
22 violence prevention training, safe school strategies, and employment
23 reentry assistance services(~~(+)~~).

24 (~~(+d)~~) (4) The community network may include funding of:

25 (a) Peer-to-peer, group, and individual counseling, including
26 crisis intervention, for at-risk youth and their parents;

27 (~~(+e)~~) (b) Youth coalitions that provide opportunities to develop
28 leadership skills and gain appropriate respect, recognition, and
29 rewards for their positive contribution to their community;

30 (~~(+f)~~) (c) Technical assistance to applicants to increase their
31 organizational capacity and to improve the likelihood of a successful
32 application; and

33 (~~(+g)~~) (d) Technical assistance and training resources to
34 successful applicants.

35 **Sec. 4.** RCW 43.41.195 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 319 are each amended to
36 read as follows:

37 (1) The office of financial management, in consultation with
38 affected parties, shall establish a fund distribution formula for

1 determining allocations to the community networks authorized under RCW
2 70.190.130. The formula shall reflect the local needs assessment for
3 at-risk children and consider:

4 (a) The number of arrests and convictions for juvenile violent
5 offenses;

6 (b) The number of arrests and convictions for crimes relating to
7 juvenile drug offenses and alcohol-related offenses;

8 (c) The number of teen pregnancies and parents;

9 (d) The number of child and teenage suicides and attempted
10 suicides; and

11 (e) The high school graduation rate.

12 (2) In developing the formula, the office of financial management
13 shall reserve five percent of the funds for the purpose of rewarding
14 community networks.

15 (3) The reserve fund shall be used by the council to reward
16 community networks that show exceptional reductions in: State-funded
17 out-of-home placements, violent criminal acts by juveniles, substance
18 abuse, teen pregnancy and male parentage, teen suicide attempts, youth
19 unemployment, or school dropout rates.

20 (4) The office of financial management shall submit the
21 distribution formula to the family policy council and to the
22 appropriate committees of the legislature by December 20, 1994.

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
