1 AN ACT Relating to the agency council on coordinated
2 transportation; and amending RCW 47.06B.020 and 47.06B.901.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 47.06B.020 and 1998 c 173 s 2 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) The agency council on coordinated transportation is created.
7 The council is composed of (~~nine~~) eleven voting members and eight
8 nonvoting, legislative members.

9 (2) The (~~nine~~) eleven voting members are the superintendent of
10 public instruction or a designee, the secretary of transportation or a
11 designee, the secretary of the department of social and health services
12 or a designee, a designee of the Washington utilities and
13 transportation commission, and (~~six~~) seven members appointed by the
14 governor as follows:

15 (a) One representative from the office of the governor;

16 (b) Two persons who are consumers of special needs transportation
17 services;

18 (c) One representative from the Washington association of pupil
19 transportation;

1 (d) One representative from the statewide metropolitan planning
2 organizations and regional transportation planning organizations
3 coordinating committee;

4 (e) One representative from the Washington state transit
5 association; and

6 ~~((e))~~ (f) One of the following:

7 (i) A representative from the community transportation association
8 of the Northwest; or

9 (ii) A representative from the community action council
10 association.

11 (3) The eight nonvoting members are legislators as follows:

12 (a) Four members from the house of representatives, two from each
13 of the two largest caucuses, appointed by the speaker of the house of
14 representatives, two who are members of the house transportation policy
15 and budget committee and two who are members of the house
16 appropriations committee; and

17 (b) Four members from the senate, two from each of the two largest
18 caucuses, appointed by the president of the senate, two members of the
19 transportation committee and two members of the ways and means
20 committee.

21 (4) Gubernatorial appointees of the council will serve two-year
22 terms. Members may not receive compensation for their service on the
23 council, but will be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses
24 incurred in performing their duties as members as set forth in RCW
25 43.03.220.

26 (5) The secretary of transportation or a designee shall serve as
27 the chair.

28 (6) The department of transportation shall provide necessary staff
29 support for the council.

30 (7) The council may receive gifts, grants, or endowments from
31 public or private sources that are made from time to time, in trust or
32 otherwise, for the use and benefit of the purposes of the council and
33 spend gifts, grants, or endowments or income from the public or private
34 sources according to their terms, unless the receipt of the gifts,
35 grants, or endowments violates RCW 42.17.710.

36 **Sec. 2.** RCW 47.06B.901 and 1999 c 385 s 8 are each amended to read
37 as follows:
