1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the  
2 following:

3 "Sec. 1. RCW 28B.10.029 and 2010 c 61 s 1 are each amended to read  
4 as follows:

5 (1)(a) An institution of higher education may exercise  
6 independently those powers otherwise granted to the director of general  
7 administration in chapter 43.19 RCW in connection with the purchase and  
8 disposition of all material, supplies, services, and equipment needed  
9 for the support, maintenance, and use of the respective institution of  
10 higher education.

11 (b) Property disposition policies followed by institutions of  
12 higher education shall be consistent with policies followed by the  
13 department of general administration.

14 (c) Purchasing policies and procedures followed by institutions of  
15 higher education shall be in compliance with chapters 39.19, 39.29, and  
16 43.03 RCW, and RCW 43.19.1901, 43.19.1906, 43.19.1911, 43.19.1917,  
17 43.19.1937, (~~(43.19.534,)~~) 43.19.685, 43.19.700 through 43.19.704, and  
18 43.19.560 through 43.19.637.

19 (d) Purchases under chapter 39.29, 43.19, or 43.105 RCW by  
20 institutions of higher education may be made by using contracts for  
21 materials, supplies, services, or equipment negotiated or entered into  
22 by, for, or through group purchasing organizations.

23 (e) The community and technical colleges shall comply with RCW  
24 43.19.450.

25 (f) Except for the University of Washington, institutions of higher  
26 education shall comply with RCW 43.41.310, 43.41.290, and 43.41.350.

27 (g) If an institution of higher education can satisfactorily  
28 demonstrate to the director of the office of financial management that  
29 the cost of compliance is greater than the value of benefits from any

1 of the following statutes, then it shall be exempt from them: RCW  
2 43.19.685, (~~43.19.534,~~) and 43.19.637.

3 (h) Any institution of higher education that chooses to exercise  
4 independent purchasing authority for a commodity or group of  
5 commodities shall notify the director of general administration.  
6 Thereafter the director of general administration shall not be required  
7 to provide those services for that institution for the duration of the  
8 general administration contract term for that commodity or group of  
9 commodities.

10 (2) The council of presidents and the state board for community and  
11 technical colleges shall convene its correctional industries business  
12 development advisory committee, and work collaboratively with  
13 correctional industries, to:

14 (a) Reaffirm purchasing criteria and ensure that quality, service,  
15 and timely delivery result in the best value for expenditure of state  
16 dollars;

17 (b) Update the approved list of correctional industries products  
18 from which higher education shall purchase; and

19 (c) Develop recommendations on ways to continue to build  
20 correctional industries' business with institutions of higher  
21 education.

22 (3) Higher education and correctional industries shall develop a  
23 plan to build higher education business with correctional industries to  
24 increase higher education purchases of correctional industries  
25 products, based upon the criteria established in subsection (2) of this  
26 section. The plan shall include the correctional industries'  
27 production and sales goals for higher education and an approved list of  
28 products from which higher education institutions shall purchase, based  
29 on the criteria established in subsection (2) of this section. Higher  
30 education and correctional industries shall report to the legislature  
31 regarding the plan and its implementation no later than January 30,  
32 2005.

33 (4)(a) Institutions of higher education shall set as a target to  
34 contract, beginning not later than June 30, 2006, to purchase one  
35 percent of the total goods and services required by the institutions  
36 each year produced or provided in whole or in part from class II inmate  
37 work programs operated by the department of corrections. Institutions  
38 of higher education shall set as a target to contract, beginning not

1 later than June 30, 2008, to purchase two percent of the total goods  
2 and services required by the institutions each year produced or  
3 provided in whole or in part from class II inmate work programs  
4 operated by the department of corrections.

5 (b) Institutions of higher education shall endeavor to assure the  
6 department of corrections has notifications of bid opportunities with  
7 the goal of meeting or exceeding the purchasing target in (a) of this  
8 subsection.

9 (5) An institution of higher education may exercise independently  
10 those powers otherwise granted to the public printer in chapter 43.78  
11 RCW in connection with the production or purchase of any printing and  
12 binding needed by the respective institution of higher education.  
13 Purchasing policies and procedures followed by institutions of higher  
14 education shall be in compliance with chapter 39.19 RCW. Any  
15 institution of higher education that chooses to exercise independent  
16 printing production or purchasing authority shall notify the public  
17 printer. Thereafter the public printer shall not be required to  
18 provide those services for that institution.

19 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate  
20 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
21 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect  
22 immediately."

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23 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "education;" strike the  
24 remainder of the title and insert "amending RCW 28B.10.029; and  
25 declaring an emergency."

EFFECT: Adds emergency clause.

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
