Abandoned Recreational Vehicle Disposal Account Reimbursements

<u>Substitute Senate Bill 5165, Section 208, subsection 10</u> requires the Department of Licensing to report any amounts reimbursed in accordance with the department's abandoned recreational vehicle disposal reimbursement program to the office of financial management and appropriate committees of the legislature on a quarterly basis, during the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium.

Background

The Abandoned Recreational Vehicle Disposal Account (Account 22J) was established during the 2018 legislative session (<u>Substitute Senate Bill 6437</u>) for deposit of the fee imposed in that legislation, as well as appropriated funds. This legislation also directed that any expenditures from this account may only be used by the department to reimburse registered tow truck operators and licensed dismantlers for up to one hundred percent of the total reasonable and auditable administrative costs for transport, dismantling, and disposal of abandoned recreational vehicles through the department's program established under Chapter 46.55 RCW.
