## Proviso

151.10.(10) $\$ 23,150,000$ of the consolidated technology services revolving account—state appropriation is provided solely for the procurement and distribution of Microsoft 365 licenses which must include advanced security features and cloud-based private branch exchange capabilities for state agencies. The office must report annually to fiscal committees of the legislature beginning December 31, 2021, and each December 31 thereafter, on the count and type of licenses distributed by consolidated technology services to each state agency. The report must also separately report on the count and type of Microsoft 365 licenses that state agencies have in addition to those that are distributed by consolidated technology services so that the total count, type of license, and cost is known for statewide Microsoft 365 licenses.

## Executive Summary

Consolidated Technology Services (WaTech) established a new consolidated enrollment agreement and received legislative support to procure Microsoft 365 (M365) G5 level licenses. These licenses include advanced security features and cloud-based private branch exchange capabilities for state agencies.

- In calendar year 2022, 78,197 M365 licenses were available and/or distributed at a cost of $\$ 39.8$ million across the enterprise.
- WaTech enrollment: WaTech procured 65,366 M365 G5 level licenses to be distributed across 68 agencies under the new WaTech enrollment. The total cost in calendar year 2022 for these licenses was $\$ 32.7$ million.
- At the time of this report, WaTech has distributed $96 \%$ of the licenses $(63,031)$ under WaTech's enrollment to agencies.
- There were 5 agencies that were identified as managing a M365 tenant model outside of the WaTech enrollment. These agencies are managing 12,831 licenses and paid $\$ 7.04$ million in calendar year 2022.


## Microsoft Licensing (by agency)

68 agencies as defined by SAAM 75.20 are in scope of this annual report.
Criteria used to determine 'in scope' include:

- Agencies that are subject to OCIO Policy 310.
- Agencies that are members of the statewide Executive branch.
- Small agencies less than 50 FTE that are supported by the WaTech Small Agency allocation.
- Non-educational agencies.
- Agencies that identified as managing a private tenant. This report only displays Microsoft Licenses related to the Ex/Gx levels.

121 agencies as defined by SAAM 75.20 were not in this report because they did not fall under scoping criteria noted above.

- 37 are educational agencies (to include colleges).
- 24 of these agencies are boards and commission agencies.
- 19 are defined as "Other" because they appear to be 'administrative' in nature.
- 9 are legislative agencies.
- 5 are judicial agencies.

Additionally, this report only displays Microsoft Licenses related to the Ex/Gx levels. Licenses related to features outside of the Microsoft $365 \mathrm{G} / E$ level services were not inventoried in this report. Example: Project Online, Visio, Power BI, Dynamics, or Azure licenses which are procured under agency enrollments.
