# 2011-2013 RECOMMENDED PROJECTS

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# **Regional Mobility Grant Program**

The Regional Mobility Grant program provides money to local governments to deliver transit mobility projects that are cost-effective, reduce travel delay for people and goods, improve connectivity between counties and regional population centers, and are consistent with local and regional transportation and land use plans. Capital construction, equipment acquisition and operating projects are eligible. Projects are competitively evaluated and a ranked list is submitted to the Legislature for appropriation. The program is funded with the Regional Mobility Account from the Multimodal Transportation Fund.

This report provides the Legislature with a recommendation for funding in the 2011-2013 biennium that includes:

- Existing projects seeking reappropriation
- Continuing four year projects
- Prioritized list of new Regional Mobility Program projects

#### Benefits from the 24 completed projects from 2006 through September 30, 2010

- 11 park and ride lot construction or expansions
- Approximately 3,574 new park and ride parking stalls built
- Three new or expanded transit centers
- Three high occupancy vehicle and business access and transit lane projects
- Nine equipment and/or operating new or expanded transit service
- One project saving over 60,000 hours annually in travel delays
- An estimated 110 million mile reduction in vehicle miles travelled
- An estimated 5.7 million reduction in vehicle trips

#### Reappropriation needed to continue six existing projects

There are six projects that have been making significant progress, but will not be able to finish before the end of the current biennium. In order to complete these projects a reappropriation of \$8,941,584 is requested.

### Proposed benefits from the six existing projects:

- One transit-only lane project
- Approximately 125 new park and ride parking stalls, new bus shelters, and intersection improvements
- One project saving over 34,000 hours annually in travel delays
- Three projects to improve speed and reliability through Transit Signal Prioritization
- An estimated 4.5 million miles reduction in vehicle miles travelled
- An estimated 747,000 reduction in vehicle trips

#### Continuing four year projects

In the 2009-2011 biennium WSDOT accepted proposals that required a four year delivery schedule without committing state funds beyond the end of 2009-2011 biennium. WSDOT implemented this strategy after considering a variety of options to address project challenges that result from a two year project time limit. All of the four year projects will meet their major project milestones before June 30, 2011. The programs commitment to these projects is that they will receive priority in the 2011-2013 Recommendation List to the Legislature.

To continue the work of the four year projects \$12,530,042 is requested. This amount is not a reappropriation request, but will be the first dollars obligated from the new 2011-2013 allocation.

## **New 2011-2013 Recommended Projects**

The historical funding level for this program is \$40 million each biennium. In response to an OFM (Office of Financial Management) request WSDOT submitted a negative decision package asking to reduce this programs funding by \$20 million for 2011-2013.

In the following table the first five projects are continuing four year projects. The next two projects have grant requests that take the programs authorization request to \$20,630,000. The next six projects take the programs authorization request to \$40,610,000.

#### Proposed benefits from projects ranked 1 and 2:

- One park and ride lot construction
- Approximately 630 new park and ride parking stalls
- One new multimodal transit center
- Three new train sets for expanded commuter rail service
- An estimated 43 million miles reduction in vehicle miles travelled
- An estimated 1.9 million reduction in vehicle trips (Some projects have more than one element)

### Proposed benefits from projects ranked 3 through 8:

- One park and ride lot expansion
- Approximately 250 new park and ride parking stalls
- · One new transit center
- One high occupancy vehicle and business access and transit lanes project
- Three projects to acquire buses and/or operate new or expanded transit service
- One project to improve speed and reliability through priority signalization for buses
- An estimated 45.5 million miles reduction in vehicle miles travelled
- An estimated 5.4 million reduction in vehicle trips (Some projects have more than one element)
