"Community first choice" or "CFC" is a medicaid state plan program defined in chapter 388-106 WAC.

"Department" means the department of social and health services of the state of Washington.

"DDA" means the developmental disabilities administration within the department of social and health services.

"Enhanced respite services" means respite care for DDA enrolled children and youth, who meet specific criteria, in a DDA contracted and licensed staffed residential setting.

"Family" means one or more of the following relatives: Spouse or registered domestic partner; natural, adoptive, or stepparent; grand-parent; child; stepchild; sibling; stepsibling; uncle; aunt; first cousin; niece; or nephew.

"Individual provider" means an employee of a consumer-directed employer who provides personal care or respite care services.

["]Intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities" or "ICF/IID" means a facility certified under federal law to provide active treatment and rehabilitation services.

"Medicaid" means the federal medical aid program under title XIX of the Social Security Act that provides health care to eligible people.

"Person-centered service plan" or "PCSP" is a document that identifies a client's goals and assessed health and welfare needs. The PCSP also indicates the paid services and natural supports that will help a client achieve their goals and address their assessed needs.

"Residential habilitation center" or "RHC" means a state-operated facility under RCW 71A.20.020.

"Respite care" means short-term intermittent care for DDA clients to provide relief for people who normally provide that care.

"State-only funded services" means those services paid entirely with state funds.

"State supplementary payment" or "SSP" is the state paid cash assistance program for certain DDA-eligible clients.

"You" or "your" means the client.

  - (13) State supplementary payments under chapter 388-827 WAC.
- (14) Transportation reimbursement for an escort, which is a payment for someone other than the driver to provide one-on-one attention to the client being transported.

- (c) DDA has determined that you can be supported safely in an RHC environment and will not pose a danger to other residents of the RHC; and
- (d) You need the level of care provided at the RHC, which is either:
- (i) Nursing facility level of care under WAC 388-106-0355 for a client admitted to, or seeking admission to, a state-operated nursing facility; or
- $(i\bar{i})$  Intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF/IID) level of care under WAC 388-828-1020 for a client admitted to, or seeking admission to, a state-operated ICF/IID.
- (2) If you are sixteen through twenty years of age, and meet (1) (a) through (d) above you may not be admitted to receive services at a residential habilitation center unless there are no service options available in the community to appropriately meet your needs. Such admission is limited to the provision of short-term respite or crisis stabilization services.
- (3) If you are under age sixteen you are not eligible to receive services at a residential habilitation center.
- (4) Admission to a nursing facility at a RHC also requires completion of preadmission screening and resident review (PASRR) requirements as described in chapter 388-97 WAC.

- (f) The child's behavior acuity level is high per WAC 388-828-5640, the ICF/ID score is eligible per WAC 388-828-4400, and the caregiver's risk score is medium, high, or immediate per WAC 388-828-5300; and/or
- (g) The child has assessed needs that exceed the scope of current services and/or is currently not eligible to receive any paid services.

- (b) An FBI fingerprint-based background check is required if the person has lived in the state of Washington less than three years.
  - (4) Provide references as requested.
- (5) Complete orientation, if contracting as an individual provider.
- (6) Sign a service provider contract to provide services to a DDD client.
  - (7) Meet additional requirements in WAC 388-825-355.

WAC 388-825-330 What is required for agencies to provide community first choice services, medicaid personal care, or respite services? (1) To provide community first choice services, medicaid personal care, or respite services a home care agency must be:

- (a) Contracted with DSHS to provide the service; and
- (b) Licensed as a home care agency or home health agency through the department of health under chapter 246-335 WAC.
- (2) If a residential agency certified under chapter 388-101 WAC wants to provide medicaid personal care services, personal care services under the community first choice program, or respite care, the agency must be:
  - (a) Contracted with DSHS to provide the service; and
- (b) Licensed as a home care agency or home health agency through the department of health under chapter 246-335 WAC.

(3) If a residential agency certified under chapter 388-101 WAC only wants to provide skills acquisition under the community first choice program, the agency must be contracted with DSHS to provide the service.

- WAC 388-825-335 Is a background check required of a long-term care worker employed by a home care agency licensed by the department of health? (1) In order to be a long-term care worker employed by a home care agency, a person must:
- (a) Complete the required DSHS form online authorizing a background check;
- (b) Disclose any disqualifying criminal convictions and pending charges as listed in chapter 388-113 WAC, and also disclose civil adjudication proceedings and negative actions as those terms are defined in WAC 388-113-0030;
- (c) Be screened through a Washington state name and date of birth background check (Preliminary results may require a thumb print for identification purposes); and
- (d) Be screened through a Washington state and national finger-print-based background check as required by RCW 74.39A.056.
- (2) Results of background checks are provided to the department and the employer or potential employer for the purpose of determining whether the person:
- (a) Is disqualified based on a disqualifying criminal conviction or a pending charge for a disqualifying crime under WAC 388-113-0020, civil adjudication proceeding or negative action under WAC 388-113-0030; or
- (b) Should or should not be employed based on his or her character, competence, or suitability.
- (3) For an applicant or service provider listed in RCW 43.43.837(1), a national fingerprint-based background check is required if the person lived out of the state of Washington in the past 36 months or is a new hire.
- (4) The department may require a long-term care worker to have a Washington state name and date of birth background check if information is disclosed or found regarding a new:
  - (a) Pending charge;
  - (b) Conviction; or
  - (c) Negative action.

  - (a) Give at least two weeks' notice;
- (b) Notify the client or the client's representative in writing; and
  - (c) Notify the client's case manager.
- (2) The individual will be expected to continue working until the termination date unless otherwise determined by DSHS.

- (2) Provide the services as outlined on the client's service plan, within the scope of practice in WAC 388-71-0215 and 388-71-0230;
- (3) Accommodate client's individual preferences and differences in providing care, within the scope of the service plan;
- (4) Contact the client's representative and case manager when there are changes which affect the personal care and other tasks listed on the service plan;
- (5) Observe the client for change(s) in health, take appropriate action, and respond to emergencies;
- (6) Notify the case manager immediately when the client enters a hospital, or moves to another setting;
  - (7) Notify the case manager immediately if the client dies;
- (8) Notify the department immediately when unable to staff/serve the client; and
- (9) Notify the department when the individual or home care agency will no longer provide services. Notification to the client/legal quardian must:
  - (a) Give at least two weeks' notice, and
  - (b) Be in writing.
- (10) Complete and keep accurate time sheets that are accessible to the social worker/case manager; and
- (11) Comply with all applicable laws, regulations and contract requirements.

WAC 388-825-380 When may the department reject the client's choice of an individual respite care, attendant care or personal care provider? The department may reject a client's request to have a family member or other person serve as his or her individual respite care, attendant care or personal care provider if the case manager has a reasonable, good faith belief that the person will be unable to appropriately meet the client's needs. Examples of circumstances indicating an inability to meet the client's needs could include, without limitation:

- (1) Evidence of alcohol or drug abuse;
- (2) Evidence of a conviction, pending charge, or negative action described in WAC 388-825-0640.
- (3) A reported history of domestic violence, no-contact orders, or criminal conduct (whether or not the conduct is automatically disqualifying under RCW 43.43.830, 43.43.842 or chapter 388-113 WAC);
- (4) A report from the client's health care provider or other knowledgeable person that the requested provider lacks the ability or willingness to provide adequate care;
- (5) Other employment or responsibilities that prevent or interfere with the provision of required services;
- (6) Excessive commuting distance that would make it impractical to provide services as they are needed and outlined in the client's service plan.

Examples of circumstances indicating jeopardy to the client include:
- (1) Evidence of a conviction, pending charges, or negative actions described in WAC 388-825-640;
- (2) Using or being under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs during working hours;
- (3) Other behavior directed toward the client or other persons involved in the client's life that places the client at risk of harm;
- (4) A report from the client's health care provider that the client's health is negatively affected by inadequate care;
- (5) A complaint from the client or client's representative that the client is not receiving adequate care;
- (6) The absence of essential interventions identified in the service plan, such as medications or medical supplies; and
  - (7) Failure to respond appropriately to emergencies.
- (8) The department, AAA, or department designee may also terminate an individual provider's contract for reasons described under WAC 388-113-0050.

#### BACKGROUND CHECK REQUIREMENTS

WAC 388-825-600 What definitions apply to WAC 388-825-600 through 388-825-690 of this chapter? The following definitions apply to WAC 388-825-600 through 388-825-690 of this chapter:

"Agency" means any agency of the state or any private agency providing services to individuals with developmental disabilities.

"Background check central unit (BCCU)" means a division within the department that processes background checks for department-authorized providers and department programs.

"Certification" means a process used by the department to determine if an applicant or service provider complies with chapter 388-101 WAC and is eligible to provide certified community residential services and supports to clients.

"Client" means a person who has a developmental disability as defined in RCW 71A.10.020(6) and has been determined eligible to receive services by DDA under chapter 388-823 WAC.

"Community residential service businesses" has the same meaning as under RCW 74.39A.009.

"DDA" means the developmental disabilities administration within the department of social and health services (DSHS).

"Department" means the department of social and health services (DSHS).

"Disqualified" means that the results of a person's background check exclude the person from a position that will or may involve unsupervised access to DDA clients.

"Individual provider" has the same meaning as defined in RCW 74.39A.240.

"Job class" means a level of work.

"Job class series" means a grouping of job functions having similar purpose and knowledge requirements but different levels of difficulty and responsibility. Where there is a professional structure that includes a job family and a job level, different job levels within one job family constitutes a class series (WAC 357-01-080).

"Long-term care worker" has the same meaning as defined in RCW 74.39A.009.

"Personal information" means any individually identifiable information that could be used to identify or contact a person and includes protected health information and financial information.

"Provider" means an individual or agency who meets the provider qualifications and is contracted with a county or DSHS to provide services to a DDA client.

"Qualified" means a person can be hired into a position that includes unsupervised access to DDA clients because the results of the person's background check are not disqualifying.

"Temporary restraining order" means a restraining order or order of protection that expired without a hearing, was dismissed following an initial hearing, or was dismissed by stipulation of the parties in lieu of an initial hearing.

"Unsupervised," under RCW 43.43.830, means not in the presence of:

- (1) Another employee or volunteer from the same business or organization as the applicant who has not been disqualified by the background check.
- (2) Any relative or guardian of a DDA client to whom the applicant has access during the course of his or her employment or involvement with the business or organization.

- WAC 388-825-605 What background check requirements apply to providers? (1) All DDA-contracted providers must follow background check requirements under chapter 388-113 and 388-825 WAC and applicable, program-specific rules.
- (2) Alternative living providers must follow background check requirements under chapters 388-113, 388-825, and 388-829A WAC.
- (3) Companion home providers must follow background check requirements under chapters 388-113, 388-825, and 388-829C WAC.
- (4) Group home providers licensed as adult family homes must follow background check requirements under chapters 388-76, 388-113, and 388-825 WAC.
- (5) Group home providers licensed as assisted living facilities must follow background check requirements under chapters 388-78A, 388-113, and 388-825 WAC.
- (6) Individual providers must follow background check requirements under chapter 388-115 WAC.
- (7) Home care agency providers must follow background check requirements under chapter 388-71 WAC.
- (8) Licensed staffed residential service providers must follow background check requirements under chapters 110-04, 388-113, and 388-825 WAC.
- (9) Overnight planned respite service providers must follow background check requirements under chapters 388-113, 388-825, and 388-829R WAC.
- (10) Supported living and group training home providers must follow background check requirements under chapters 388-101D, 388-113, and 388-825 WAC.

  - (a) Unsupervised access to a DDA client; or
  - (b) Access to a DDA client's personal information.
- (2) For community residential service businesses, any person who provides instruction and support services (ISS), including volunteers, must have a background check and background check renewal and follow background check requirements under this chapter.
- (3) All residential habilitation center employees and volunteers must have a background check. If a residential habilitation center employee changes job class series, the employee must have a background check renewal as required by RCW 43.43.837.

- WAC 388-825-615 What type of background check is required? (1) Long-term care workers and providers undergoing a background check for initial hire or initial contract must be screened through a Washington state name and date of birth check and a national fingerprint-based background check as required by RCW 43.43.837.
- (2) For a renewal, a person who has continuously resided in Washington state for the past 36 months must be screened through a Washington state name and date of birth check.
- (3) For a renewal, a person who has resided outside of Washington state in the past 36 months must be screened through a Washington state name and date of birth check and a national fingerprint-based background check as required by RCW 43.43.837.
- (4) For adult family homes, refer to chapter 388-76 WAC. For assisted living facilities, refer to chapter 388-78A WAC.(5) Beginning July 23, 2023, a residential habilitation center
- (5) Beginning July 23, 2023, a residential habilitation center (RHC) applicant undergoing a background check for initial hire must be screened through a Washington state name and date of birth check and a national fingerprint-based background check. An RHC employee must complete a background check renewal, which includes a fingerprint check,

when applying for a change in job class series or transferring from one RHC to another, as required by RCW 43.43.837.

(6) All background checks must be completed through the online background check system.

- WAC 388-825-620 How often must a background check be renewed? (1) DDA requires a background check at least every 36 months, or more frequently if required by program rule.

- (a) A person who has continuously resided in Washington state for the past 36 months must be screened through a state name and date of birth background check.
- (b) A person who has lived outside of Washington state within the past 36 months must be screened through a state name and date of birth check and a national fingerprint-based background check as required by RCW 43.43.837.
- (c) A person who lives outside of Washington state and provides DDA services in Washington state must be screened through a Washington state name and date of birth check and a national fingerprint-based background check.
- (3) The department may require a long-term care worker or residential habilitation center employee to have a renewed Washington state name and date of birth background check if information is disclosed or found regarding a new:
  - (a) Pending charge;
  - (b) Conviction; or
  - (c) Negative action.

- (b) The employee is directly supervised while around clients and their personal information; and
  - (c) The agency has a supervision plan in place for the employee.
  - (2) A supervision plan must:
  - (a) State who will supervise the employee; and
- (b) Describe how the employee's breaks will be managed until the employee's background check has cleared.

- (d) Department of health.
- (e) Civil adjudication proceedings.
- (f) Applicant's self-disclosure.
- (q) Out-of-state law enforcement and court records.
- (2) DDA requires fingerprint-based background checks as described in WAC 388-825-615. These background checks include a review of conviction records through the Washington state patrol, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and the Washington state sex offender registry.

(1) Criminal convictions and pending charges that are disqualifying are listed in chapter 388-113 WAC.

- (2) The following negative actions will automatically disqualify an individual from having unsupervised access to individuals with a developmental disability:
- (a) A final finding of abuse, neglect, financial exploitation or abandonment of a vulnerable adult, unless the finding was made by Adult Protective Services prior to October 2003.
- (b) A final finding of abuse or neglect by child protective services, unless the finding was made prior to October 1, 1998.
- (c) A court ordered permanent restraining order/order of protection, either active or expired, against the individual that was based upon abuse, neglect, financial exploitation, or mistreatment of a child or vulnerable adult.
  - (d) Registered sex offender status.

with developmental disabilities only after a character, competence and suitability review has been conducted as required by WAC 388-825-065.

WAC 388-825-650 What does a character, competence, and suitability review include? The contractor, entity, or hiring authority must review an individual's background to determine character, competence, and suitability to have unsupervised access to individuals with a developmental disability. In this review, the contractor, entity, or hiring authority must consider the following factors:

- (1) The amount of time that has passed since a person was convicted or subject to a negative action;
- (2) The seriousness of the crime or action that led to the conviction or finding;
- (3) The number and types of other convictions in the person's background;
  - (4) The person's age at the time of conviction;
- (5) Documentation indicating the person has successfully completed all court-ordered programs and restitution;
  - (6) The person's behavior since the conviction; and
- (7) The vulnerability of those that would be under the person's care.
