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## Testing for College Credit: CLEP and DSST Programs

### **CLEP and DSST tests: What are they?**

Through College Level Examination Program (CLEP) or DANTES Subject Standardized Tests (DSST) you can get credit for college-level knowledge you've acquired through experience or self-study. Most of the tests are multiple choice but there are essay requirements for some English examinations and a speech is required for the DSST Public Speaking. Servicemembers can take the exams free of charge while others are charged fees.

#### Easier than passing a class?

Many people are attracted to credit by examination because they believe it will be easier than taking a class; however, the tests ensure academic standards and are very challenging.

#### **How can I get started?**

Prior to testing, you need to know the college's CLEP/DSST acceptance policy and any passing score requirements. The Army recognizes passing a CLEP/DSST exam as valid college credit for promotion point purposes; however, not all colleges accept the credit toward degree completion. Consider whether the time you spend preparing for the examination is worthwhile if your college doesn't accept it.

Preparation is key! There are no funded retests for Servicemembers. Study materials for specific exams are available at most installation Libraries. Free full-length practice exams are also available at <a href="https://www.petersons.com/dod">www.petersons.com/dod</a> or use the links from your AKO account under Self Service → My Library. If you are consistently scoring above 75% on a practice exam, you're probably ready to test. #### Costs?

Costs for non-Servicemembers or for Servicemembers retesting are \$77 for CLEP and \$80 for DSST. Non-military ID cardholders also pay a \$25 administration fee.

#### Where do I go to take the test?

At JBLM, CLEP and DSST examinations are administered by Pierce College. The testing schedule and registration information is available in the Pierce College office at Stone Education Center, room 145, online at <a href="https://www.pierce.ctc.edu/military">www.pierce.ctc.edu/military</a> or by phone: 253-964-6567. All tests are computerized.

#### **BUYER BEWARE...Watch out for scams!**

There have been numerous complaints regarding companies selling highly questionable test preparation products and services specifically targeted at military members and their Families. You must beware of:

- Salespersons who want to sell you test prep services for tests with payment up front or on credit.
- Direct sales contact at your home.
- Promises that you can get college credit without enrolling in college.
- Book lists that include dictionaries or encyclopedias.

Before you buy any test prep service or invest hundreds or thousands of dollars, check it out with your local education center. Numerous free and low-cost test preparation alternatives are available either at the Education Center, the library, or through college bookstores.
