Effect Statement:

- Removes the prohibitions on the sale and distribution of plastic straws.
- Removes requirements for DOH and DSHS to provide recommendations addressing the needs of health care facilities and individuals with disabilities.
- Provides that food service establishments may not provide a singleuse plastic straw to a customer except upon request.
- Requires food service establishment to provide a straw upon request to persons with disabilities.
- Requires local ordinances restricting the use of plastic straws to at least meet the requirements of the act.

AN ACT Relating to restricting single-use plastic straws at food service establishments; adding a new chapter to Title 70 RCW; and prescribing penalties.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The definitions in this section apply 6 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires 7 otherwise.

8 (1) "Consumer" means a person who is a member of the public, 9 takes possession of food, is not functioning in the capacity of an 10 operator of a food facility, and does not offer the food for resale.

11 (2) "Food service establishment" means establishments that serve 12 food, beverages, or prepared food for consumption including 13 establishments:

(a) With the primary business purpose of serving food to be consumed on the premises or providing prepared meals or other food or beverage items that a consumer purchases and intends to eat elsewhere; or

(b) That serve food, beverages, and prepackaged food and beverages: (i) Via a drive through; (ii) in a packaged form for take out or take away; or (iii) from stands or kiosks that provide no shelter or seating for consumers.

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1 (3) "Local health jurisdiction" or "jurisdictional health 2 department" means an administrative agency organized under chapter 3 70.05 RCW, a health district organized under chapter 70.46 RCW, or a 4 combined city-county health department organized under chapter 70.08 5 RCW, that administers public health and safety regulations and codes, 6 including food safety and restaurant inspections.

7 (4) "Plastic beverage straw" means a tube made predominantly of 8 plastic derived from either petroleum or a biologically based 9 polymer, such as corn or other plant sources, and including 10 compostable and biodegradable petroleum or biologically based polymer 11 straws, for transferring a beverage from its container to the mouth 12 of the drinker.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. (1) Beginning January 1, 2020, a food 14 service establishment may not provide a single-use plastic straw to a 15 consumer unless requested by the consumer.

16 (2) In recognition that a straw is an adaptive utensil that may 17 provide basic accommodation for persons with disabilities to eat and 18 drink, a food service establishment must provide a single-use plastic 19 straw upon request to persons with disabilities.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. (1) The local health jurisdiction or a 21 jurisdictional health department must enforce this chapter.

(a) The local health jurisdiction or a jurisdictional health
department must provide notice of violation to any person for the
first and second violation of section 2 of this act.

(b) For the third and subsequent violations of section 2 of this act, a person is subject to a civil penalty of twenty-five dollars for each day not to exceed three hundred dollars per year.

(2) Penalties collected under this section may be retained by the local health jurisdiction or jurisdictional health department for enforcement activities.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. By January 1, 2020, city, county, or 32 municipal corporation ordinances restricting the use of plastic 33 straws must at least meet the requirements imposed under section 2 of 34 this act.

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1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. Sections 1 through 4 of this act 2 constitute a new chapter in Title 70 RCW.

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
