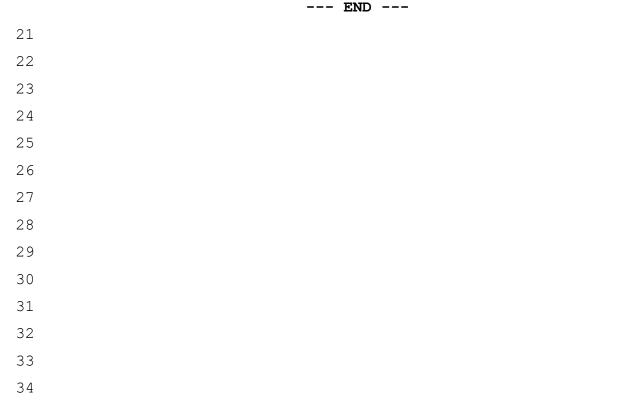

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<u>EFFECT:</u> (1) Adds a requirement that a waiver to be submitted by the Health Care Authority (Authority) to allow for full financial participation for services provided in Institutions of Mental Diseases must allow for implementation by July 1st, 2020. Increases the Authority's general fund-federal appropriation based on the assumed waiver in fiscal year 2021 and reduces the Authority's general fund-state appropriation for that year by the same amount (ongoing). (2) Requires that appropriations provided for start-up costs for the School Employees Benefits Program in the current bill, and in the 2018 supplemental operating budget, must be repaid with interest to the general fund by June 30, 2022 (one-time). (3) Reduces the General Fund-State funding provided to the Department of Natural Resources for fire suppression costs in fiscal year 2019 by \$38,938,000 (one-time).

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: Reduces General Fund-State appropriations by a total of \$55,176,000. Increases General Fund-Federal appropriations by \$16,238,000. Increases the amount assumed to be repaid in FY 2022 from the School Employees' Administrative Account to the General Fund-State by \$25,730,000.



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
