## Proposed Substitute House Bill 2168 By Representative Tarleton H-3111.2

## **Summary of Proposed Substitute**

- An eligible hospital is not subject to business and occupation tax.
- An "eligible hospital" is defined as one that is owned by a county with a population greater than 2 million and managed by a state university.
- The act is effective July 1, 2019 and contains an emergency clause.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Concerning tax preferences.

1 AN ACT Relating to tax preferences; adding a new section to 2 chapter 82.04 RCW; creating a new section; providing an effective 3 date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. 1. This section is the tax preference Sec. 6 performance statement for the tax preference contained in section 2, 7 chapter . . ., Laws of 2019 (section 2 of this act). This performance 8 statement is only intended to be used for subsequent evaluation of the tax preference. It is not intended to create a private right of 9 10 action by any party or be used to determine eligibility for 11 preferential tax treatment.

12 (1) The legislature categorizes this tax preference as one 13 intended to provide tax relief to certain eligible businesses, as 14 indicated in RCW 82.32.808(2)(e).

15 (2) The joint legislative audit and review committee is directed 16 to evaluate the role eligible hospitals play as safety net providers, 17 using metrics including but not limited to:

18 (a) The monetary value of the following services provided by each19 eligible hospital:

20 (i) Uncompensated care, by category of health care services; and

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1 (ii) Medicaid and medicare funded treatment, by category of 2 health care services;

3 (b) Percentage and count of all clients served by each eligible 4 hospital, by category of health care services, who:

5 (i) Receive uncompensated care; and

6 (ii) Use medicare or medicaid to pay for treatment; and

7 (c) Percentage and count of all clients served in all hospitals 8 in Washington who:

9 (i) Receive uncompensated care from an eligible hospital, by 10 category of health care services;

11 (ii) Use medicare and medicaid to pay for treatment from an 12 eligible hospital, by category of health care services; and

13 (iii) Receive uncompensated trauma care from an eligible 14 hospital.

15 (3) For the purposes of this section, "eligible hospital" means a 16 taxpayer claiming the tax preference provided in section 2, 17 chapter . ., Laws of 2019 (section 2 of this act).

18 (4) In order to obtain the data necessary to perform the review 19 in this section, the joint legislative audit and review committee may 20 refer to data from the health care authority and the department of 21 health, as well as any other available data sources.

22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 82.04 23 RCW to read as follows:

(1) This chapter does not apply to any person engaging within
this state in business as a hospital, as defined in chapter 70.41
RCW, that is owned by a county with a population greater than two
million and that is managed by a state university.

28 (2) This section expires January 1, 2030.

29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate 30 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 31 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 32 effect July 1, 2019.

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
