# What is Community Engagement?

A comprehensive community engagement program will be critical to identify a solution that reflects community values and can earn broad regional support

Community engagement is public involvement that brings citizens into the planning process with an emphasis on two-way dialogue

- Prioritizes access and participation of diverse communities in decision making
- Identifies important goals and issues
- Informs decision making and helps ensure there are no unintended biases
- Improves credibility and trust in the process



## What is a Community Engagement Plan?

Creates a framework that ensures all voices are heard and defines the methods that will be used

- Focuses on how you will communicate and ensures people have a voice in the decision-making process
- Emphasizes the fair and meaningful involvement of all people including minority and low-income populations
- Is dynamic and will be evaluated and assessed throughout the life of the program to make adjustments as needed



### What does a Community Engagement Plan Include?

- Identifies community stakeholders to focus engagement efforts
- Defines goals and objectives for stakeholder engagement
- Identifies methods and approach to conduct outreach
- Provides approaches tailored to communities and stakeholders
- Develops evaluation criteria to measure success and make adjustments if necessary

- Virtual and/or live stream meetings
- Community surveys and polling
- Videos
- Mailers/e-newsletters
- Traditional media (press releases, editorial boards, authored content)



# **Review of Previous Community Engagement**

Examples of previous goals and objectives:

Provide opportunities for meaningful public engagement

- Ongoing project updates through presentations, attendance at community events, open houses, print and electronic communications, and the media
- Reach people where they are on their terms and schedules

Targeted outreach to limited-English, low-income and minority populations

- Partner with organizations that represent their interests
- Hold outreach events at locations in their communities

#### What We've Heard: Initial Committee Guidance

- Extensive and meaningful community engagement is critical
- Dynamic two-way communication is needed (don't just inform)
- Communities beyond those immediately adjacent to the bridge corridor need to have their voices heard
- Diverse range of interests and perspectives on both sides of the river need to be included, including statewide users
- Find a balance to keep work moving forward without sacrificing effective community engagement
- Adapt to current situation find ways to engage virtually as well as reach people without flexible schedules or access to technology



#### What We've Heard: Opportunities for Improvement


- Strengthen ongoing engagement with legislators
- Focus on quality of interactions for authentic community engagement
- Strengthen efforts to develop community-based ownership of the project
- Expand opportunities for discussions on values, not just technical elements
- Utilize innovative outreach tools, not just "traditional" approaches
- Proactively address controversial topics
- Support meaningful two-way conversations with the public
- Be responsive to the public and report back how their comments were considered or incorporated







# **Initial Draft Principles of Engagement**

Community engagement efforts will seek to provide extensive, inclusive and ongoing opportunities for meaningful two-way communication that prioritizes:






## **Initial Draft Goals for Community Engagement**

- Provide avenues to meaningfully shape program development and inform decisions
- Seek feedback about community values, priorities, needs, concerns, and interests from a diverse range of stakeholders
- Proactively seek to include currently and historically underrepresented and underserved populations
- Embrace innovative ways to achieve meaningful two-way communication
- Remove or minimize barriers to engagement
- Demonstrate accountability be transparent and communicate how public comments are considered and how decisions are made

### Next Steps to Develop Draft Engagement Plan

- Develop draft goals and objectives for outreach
- Identify best practices and innovative techniques for effective engagement
- Identify interactive website and online engagement tools for virtual engagement
- Identify ways to reach those without access to technology
- Identify historically underrepresented and underserved communities and special considerations such as translation services
- Develop strategies to effectively engage with historically underrepresented and underserved communities
- Build stakeholder and targeted outreach lists




