

Employment declines greater than the deepest point of the Great Recession

volatility.


Significant uncertainty around near-term recovery


Alarming disease trajectory heading towards winter with no additional federal support

Only includes regular program claims (No PUA, PEUC, or Shared Work)







Trends: Industry sectors
