## Impact of COVID-19 closures on Hospitality Industry

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# It costs the average restaurant \$25,000 to stay closed for a month

- The average hard costs for a restaurant in Washington, including everything from licensing to lease payments, is \$25,000
- That means the average restaurant owner loses \$25,000 for every month they are completely closed.
- Take-out only averages only 10% of prior sales, still resulting in over \$20k in average monthly losses.



## We know we can operate safely

- Washington has among the strictest COVID-19 restaurant guidelines in the nation
- 45 other states allow indoor dining
- New York state, which has collected the most data on the spread of COVID-19 of any state in the nation, found just 1.4 percent of cases were connected to restaurants.
- This matches Washington state's own contact tracing data, where epilink tracing data found less than 1% of cases coming from restaurants
- A well-regulated restaurant can provide a safe place to gather rather than driving people to gather privately without safety precautions, which accounts for the majority of the spread.

### The bell curve of capacity

People need a safe regulated outlet, we have proven we can provide it.
