RCW 79A.80.020 and 2017 c 121 s 1 are each amended 7 to read as follows: 8 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a discover 9 pass is required for any motor vehicle to: 10 (a) Park at any recreation site or lands; or 11 (b) Operate on any recreation site or lands. 12 13 (2) Except as provided in RCW 79A.80.110 and for fiscal year 14 2023, the cost of a discover pass is thirty dollars. Every four 15 years the office of financial management must review the cost of the 16 discover pass and, if necessary, recommend to the legislature an 17 adjustment to the cost of the discover pass to account for 18 inflation. (3) A discover pass is valid for one year beginning from the 19 20 date that the discover pass is marked for activation. The activation 21 date may differ from the purchase date pursuant to any policies 22 developed by the agencies. (4) Sales of discover passes must be consistent with RCW 23 79A.80.100. 24 (5) The discover pass must contain space for two motor vehicle 25 26 license plate numbers. A discover pass is valid only for those 27 vehicle license plate numbers written on the pass. However, the

1 agencies may offer for sale a family discover pass that is fully 2 transferable among vehicles and does not require the placement of a 3 license plate number on the pass to be valid. The agencies must 4 collectively set a price for the sale of a family discover pass that 5 is no more than fifty dollars. A discover pass is valid only for use 6 with one motor vehicle at any one time.

7 (6)(a) One complimentary discover pass must be provided to a 8 volunteer who performed twenty-four hours of service on agency-9 sanctioned volunteer projects in a year. The agency must provide 10 vouchers to volunteers identifying the number of volunteer hours 11 they have provided for each project. The vouchers may be brought to 12 an agency to be redeemed for a discover pass.

(b) Married spouses under chapter 26.04 RCW may present an agency with combined vouchers demonstrating the collective performance of twenty-four hours of service on agency-sanctioned volunteer projects in a year to be redeemed for a single complimentary discover pass.

18 <u>(7) For fiscal year 2023, a discover pass must be provided to</u> 19 <u>the public free of charge. The commission must provide discover</u> 20 <u>passes to all vendor sites for distribution. The commission must</u> 21 <u>provide the department of licensing discover passes to make</u> 22 <u>available to all people who are purchasing vehicle licensing within</u> 23 <u>fiscal year 2023.</u>"
