Effect: Strikes the underlying bill and replaces it with language from Senate Bill 5981, which specifically:

- Adds a definition of "Plant Cannabis" in the Uniform Controlled Substances Act (UCSA), which means all plants of the genus Cannabis, including cannabis and hemp;
- Removes proposed qualifying language in the definition of "tetrahydrocannabinol" or "THC" that stated THC included concentrated resins or cannabinoids and their products, produced from the plant Cannabis, whether or not the cannabinoids were derived from a cannabis plant containing a THC concentration greater than 0.3 percent on a dry weight basis;
- Amends the definition of "THC concentration" in the UCSA to include all tetrahydrocannabinols instead of only delta-9 THC;
- Provides that products containing or consisting of cannabinoids produced and processed for human consumption, whether marketed as such or not, exceeding a THC concentration of 0.3 percent, may only be sold by a licensed cannabis producer, processor, or retailer unless authorized as a drug by the federal Food and Drug Administration. Unadulterated and unprocessed hemp flower is exempted;
- Provides that products containing a THC concentration of 0.3 percent or less sold by any person other than a state cannabis licensee must contain a 20:1 ratio of cannabidiol (CBD) or other non-THC cannabinoids to THC, and must not exceed two milligrams of THC per serving. Unadulterated and unprocessed hemp flower is exempted;
- Requires the Washington State University Center for Cannabis Policy, Research, and Outreach, contingent on funding, to convene a scientific panel (Panel) that will review available research, data, and regulations of other jurisdictions relative to defining the terms "impairing," "artificial cannabinoids," and "synthetically derived cannabinoids," in addition to making recommendations on safe manufacturing, extracting, and synthesizing of cannabinoids. The Panel must report to the Legislature by December 1, 2022;
- Directs the Department of Health, contingent on funding, to establish a grant program to assist local health departments enforce unauthorized sales of cannabinoids;
- Contains a severability and an emergency clause relative to certain sections in the bill;
- Changes the term "marijuana" to "cannabis" in the new bill language; and
- Modifies the title and intent section language.

 - (y) "Marijuana" or "marihuana" means all parts of the plant Cannabis, whether growing or not, with a THC concentration greater than 0.3 percent on a dry weight basis; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant, its seeds or resin. The term does not include:
 - (1) The mature stalks of the plant, fiber produced from the stalks, oil or cake made from the seeds of the plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the mature stalks (except the resin extracted therefrom), fiber, oil, or cake, or the sterilized seed of the plant which is incapable of germination; or
- 38 (2) Hemp or industrial hemp as defined in RCW 15.140.020, seeds 39 used for licensed hemp production under chapter 15.140 RCW.

(z) "Marijuana concentrates" means products consisting wholly or in part of the resin extracted from any part of the plant *Cannabis* and having a THC concentration greater than ten percent.

- (aa) "Marijuana processor" means a person licensed by the board to process marijuana into marijuana concentrates, useable marijuana, and marijuana-infused products, package and label marijuana concentrates, useable marijuana, and marijuana-infused products for sale in retail outlets, and sell marijuana concentrates, useable marijuana, and marijuana-infused products at wholesale to marijuana retailers.
- (bb) "Marijuana producer" means a person licensed by the board to produce and sell marijuana at wholesale to marijuana processors and other marijuana producers.
- (cc) "Marijuana products" means useable marijuana, marijuana concentrates, and marijuana-infused products as defined in this section.
- (dd) "Marijuana researcher" means a person licensed by the board to produce, process, and possess marijuana for the purposes of conducting research on marijuana and marijuana-derived drug products.
- (ee) "Marijuana retailer" means a person licensed by the board to sell marijuana concentrates, useable marijuana, and marijuana-infused products in a retail outlet.
- (ff) "Marijuana-infused products" means products that contain marijuana or marijuana extracts, are intended for human use, are derived from marijuana as defined in subsection (y) of this section, and have a THC concentration no greater than ten percent. The term "marijuana-infused products" does not include either useable marijuana or marijuana concentrates.
- (gg) "Narcotic drug" means any of the following, whether produced directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of vegetable origin, or independently by means of chemical synthesis, or by a combination of extraction and chemical synthesis:
- (1) Opium, opium derivative, and any derivative of opium or opium derivative, including their salts, isomers, and salts of isomers, whenever the existence of the salts, isomers, and salts of isomers is possible within the specific chemical designation. The term does not include the isoquinoline alkaloids of opium.
- (2) Synthetic opiate and any derivative of synthetic opiate, including their isomers, esters, ethers, salts, and salts of isomers, esters, and ethers, whenever the existence of the isomers, esters, Code Rev/KB:eab

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- 1 ethers, and salts is possible within the specific chemical 2 designation.
 - (3) Poppy straw and concentrate of poppy straw.
- 4 (4) Coca leaves, except coca leaves and extracts of coca leaves 5 from which cocaine, ecgonine, and derivatives or ecgonine or their 6 salts have been removed.
 - (5) Cocaine, or any salt, isomer, or salt of isomer thereof.
- 8 (6) Cocaine base.

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- 9 (7) Ecgonine, or any derivative, salt, isomer, or salt of isomer 10 thereof.
 - (8) Any compound, mixture, or preparation containing any quantity of any substance referred to in (1) through (7) of this subsection.
 - (hh) "Opiate" means any substance having an addiction-forming or addiction-sustaining liability similar to morphine or being capable of conversion into a drug having addiction-forming or addiction-sustaining liability. The term includes opium, substances derived from opium (opium derivatives), and synthetic opiates. The term does not include, unless specifically designated as controlled under RCW 69.50.201, the dextrorotatory isomer of 3-methoxy-n-methylmorphinan and its salts (dextromethorphan). The term includes the racemic and levorotatory forms of dextromethorphan.
- 22 (ii) "Opium poppy" means the plant of the species Papaver 23 somniferum L., except its seeds.
 - (jj) "Person" means individual, corporation, business trust, estate, trust, partnership, association, joint venture, government, governmental subdivision or agency, or any other legal or commercial entity.
 - (kk) "Plant" has the meaning provided in RCW 69.51A.010.
- (11) "Plant Cannabis" means all plants of the genus Cannabis,
 including cannabis as defined in this section, and hemp as defined in
 RCW 15.140.020.
- 32 <u>(mm)</u> "Poppy straw" means all parts, except the seeds, of the 33 opium poppy, after mowing.
- 34 (((mm))) <u>(nn)</u> "Practitioner" means:
- (1) A physician under chapter 18.71 RCW; a physician assistant under chapter 18.71A RCW; an osteopathic physician and surgeon under chapter 18.57 RCW; an optometrist licensed under chapter 18.53 RCW who is certified by the optometry board under RCW 18.53.010 subject to any limitations in RCW 18.53.010; a dentist under chapter 18.32 RCW; a podiatric physician and surgeon under chapter 18.22 RCW; a Code Rev/KB:eab

- 1 veterinarian under chapter 18.92 RCW; a registered nurse, advanced registered nurse practitioner, or licensed practical nurse under 2 chapter 18.79 RCW; a naturopathic physician under chapter 18.36A RCW 3 who is licensed under RCW 18.36A.030 subject to any limitations in 4 RCW 18.36A.040; a pharmacist under chapter 18.64 RCW or a scientific 5 6 investigator under this chapter, licensed, registered or otherwise permitted insofar as is consistent with those licensing laws to 7 distribute, dispense, conduct research with respect to or administer 8 a controlled substance in the course of their professional practice 9 or research in this state. 10
 - (2) A pharmacy, hospital or other institution licensed, registered, or otherwise permitted to distribute, dispense, conduct research with respect to or to administer a controlled substance in the course of professional practice or research in this state.
 - (3) A physician licensed to practice medicine and surgery, a physician licensed to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery, a dentist licensed to practice dentistry, a podiatric physician and surgeon licensed to practice podiatric medicine and surgery, a licensed physician assistant or a licensed osteopathic physician assistant specifically approved to prescribe controlled substances by his or her state's medical commission or equivalent and his or her supervising physician, an advanced registered nurse practitioner licensed to prescribe controlled substances, or a veterinarian licensed to practice veterinary medicine in any state of the United States.
 - (((nn))) <u>(oo)</u> "Prescription" means an order for controlled substances issued by a practitioner duly authorized by law or rule in the state of Washington to prescribe controlled substances within the scope of his or her professional practice for a legitimate medical purpose.
- 31 (((oo))) <u>(pp)</u> "Production" includes the manufacturing, planting, 32 cultivating, growing, or harvesting of a controlled substance.
- 33 $((\frac{pp}))$ (qq) "Qualifying patient" has the meaning provided in 34 RCW 69.51A.010.
- $((\frac{(qq)}{(pq)}))$ <u>(rr)</u> "Recognition card" has the meaning provided in RCW 69.51A.010.
- $((\frac{(rr)}{(rr)}))$ <u>(ss)</u> "Retail outlet" means a location licensed by the board for the retail sale of marijuana concentrates, useable marijuana, and marijuana-infused products.

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- 1 (((ss))) (tt) "Secretary" means the secretary of health or the 2 secretary's designee.
 - (((tt))) <u>(uu)</u> "State," unless the context otherwise requires, means a state of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, or a territory or insular possession subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.
- 7 ((\(\frac{\text{(uu}\)}{\text{)}}\)) (vv) "Tetrahydrocannabinol" or "THC" includes all 8 tetrahydrocannabinols that are artificially, synthetically, or 9 naturally derived including, but not limited to, delta-8 10 tetrahydrocannabinol, delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol, delta-10 11 tetrahydrocannabinol, THCv tetrahydrocannabivarin, THCP 12 tetrahydrocannabiphorol, THC-O-Acetate, and the optical isomers of 13 THC cannabinoids.
 - (ww) "THC concentration" means percent of ((delta-9)) tetrahydrocannabinol content per dry weight of any part of the plant Cannabis, or per volume or weight of marijuana product, or the combined percent of ((delta-9)) tetrahydrocannabinol and tetrahydrocannabinolic acid in any part of the plant Cannabis regardless of moisture content.
 - (((vv))) (xx) "Ultimate user" means an individual who lawfully possesses a controlled substance for the individual's own use or for the use of a member of the individual's household or for administering to an animal owned by the individual or by a member of the individual's household.
- 25 (((ww))) <u>(yy)</u> "Useable marijuana" means dried marijuana flowers. 26 The term "useable marijuana" does not include either marijuana-27 infused products or marijuana concentrates.
 - (((xx))) <u>(zz)</u> "Youth access" means the level of interest persons under the age of twenty-one may have in a vapor product, as well as the degree to which the product is available or appealing to such persons, and the likelihood of initiation, use, or addiction by adolescents and young adults.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 69.50 RCW to read as follows:
- 35 (1) Products containing or consisting of cannabinoids produced 36 and processed for any type of consumption into a human body, whether 37 marketed as such or not, exceeding a THC concentration of 0.3 38 percent, may only be sold by a cannabis producer, cannabis processor,

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- or cannabis retailer licensed by the board unless authorized as a drug by the federal food and drug administration.
- 3 (2) Products containing a THC concentration of 0.3 percent or 4 less sold by any person other than a cannabis producer, cannabis 5 processor, or cannabis retailer licensed by the board must contain at 6 least a 20:1 ratio of cannabidiol or other non-THC cannabinoids to 7 THC, and must not exceed two milligrams of THC per serving.
- 8 (3) This section does not apply to unadulterated hemp flower that 9 is not further processed into extracts, infused products, or 10 concentrates.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. (1) The Washington State University center for cannabis policy, research, and outreach shall convene a scientific panel consisting of the following members:
 - (a) An expert in pharmacology;
- 15 (b) An expert in toxicology;

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- 16 (c) An expert with regulatory affairs experience in 17 nutraceutical, pharmaceutical, or dietary supplements;
 - (d) An expert in organic chemistry; and
- 19 (e) An expert in cannabis research.
 - (2) Of the members in subsection (1) of this section, at least one member must be a representative of the University of Washington and one member must be a representative of Washington State University. The member representing Washington State University shall serve as chair of the scientific panel and shall form and oversee the scientific panel.
 - (3) The scientific panel shall review available research, data, and regulations of other jurisdictions related to cannabinoids including but not limited to:
- 29 (a) Definitions of the term impairing in relation to a 30 cannabinoid, as well as definitions of artificial and synthetically 31 derived cannabinoids; and
- 32 (b) Recommendations on potential guidelines for safe methods of 33 manufacturing, extracting, and synthesizing cannabinoids.
- 34 (4) The panel shall compile findings and make recommendations to 35 the legislature regarding regulating cannabinoids in the adult use 36 cannabis market, by December 1, 2022.
 - (5) This section expires January 1, 2023.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 69.50 RCW to read as follows:
 - (1) When funded, the department of health shall establish a grant program to assist local government health departments with enforcing and ensuring compliance with section 4 of this act. Local government health departments and agencies may apply for grants, when funded under this section.
 - (2) Each grant applicant shall:

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- 9 (a) Show a significant problem of the sale in the jurisdiction of 10 products in violation of section 4 of this act by businesses not 11 licensed by the board as cannabis producers, processors, or 12 retailers;
- 13 (b) Verify that grant awards are sufficient to cover increased 14 costs associated with undertaking enforcement and compliance 15 activities related to section 4 of this act;
- 16 (c) Design an enforcement and compliance program that best suits 17 the specific problems in the jurisdiction related to violations of 18 section 4 of this act;
- 19 (d) Demonstrate community coordination focusing on prevention, 20 intervention, and suppression of violations of section 4 of this act; 21 and
- (e) Collect data on performance.
- 23 (3) The cost of administering the grants shall not exceed \$60,000, or three percent of appropriated funding, whichever is greater.
- 26 (4) Grant awards may not be used to supplant preexisting funding 27 sources for special enforcement targeting enforcement of laws that 28 prohibit the sale of products identified in section 4 of this act.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. If specific funding for the purposes of sections 5 and 6 of this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 2022, in the omnibus appropriations act, sections 5 and 6 of this act are null and void.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
