

## Transition to Kindergarten (TK) is a program for 4-years-olds identified to need additional preparation to be successful kindergarten students in the following school year

- HB 1550 (2023) established the program
   Prior to 2023 TK was funded as K
- After 2023 funded in a manner similar to a kindergarten student
- Funded per annual full-time equivalent (AAFTE)
- Funding increases as enrollment increases






#### Started tracking for purposes of the forecast in the 2019-2020 school year (FY 2021)

 Prior to 2023, TK counted as K for purposes of funding


#### **TK Enrollment Over Time**





## ESIT is an early intervention service for birth to 3 with developmental delays

- FY 2025 2027 incorporates November 2024 Forecast estimates
- Funding is GF-State &
   \$10M/yr federal IDEA\* funds.
- Majority of caseload growth from FY 2024 to FY 2025 is due to a count adjustment per <u>HB</u> 1916 (2024) not increase in children served.



## ESIT is an early intervention service for birth to 3 with developmental delays

- FY 2025 2027 incorporates November 2024 Forecast estimates
- Reimbursement rate is 1.15x the SpEd BEA\* rate (RCW 43.216.580)
- The per cap has increased as the BEA rate has increased.







### **ECEAP** is preschool for eligible families

- 2023-25 Budget includes \$91M ELTA\* & \$80M Opp Pthwys Accounts. Remainder GF-State.
- Slots are Part-Day (PD), School-Day (SD), or Working-Day (WD).
- Slot numbers are *not* driven by forecasting (non-entitlement). Slots are expanded at policy level.
- ECEAP becomes entitlement in FY 2027 (RCW 43.216.556)\*\*





## **ECEAP** is preschool for eligible families


- Slots are either Part-Day (PD), School-Day (SD), or Working-Day (WD).
- Rates vary by slot. Chart displays average.
- State has funded rate increases in recent years
- Current rates:
  - PD: \$9,836
  - SD: \$15,638
  - WD: \$23,411





#### WCCC is subsidized childcare, aged 0 to 12

- FY 2025 2027 incorporates November 2024 Forecast estimates
- Budget displayed is (a) Base
   Subsidy + (b) <u>Tiered Reimbursement</u>
- FY 2025 Fund Sources:
  - \$381.2M GF-State
  - \$135.8M <u>ELTA</u>\* Acct (state)
  - \$176.7M TANF\*\* (federal)
  - \$174.5M CCDF\*\*\* (federal)
- Caseload:
  - Peaked Jun. 2010 (39,697)
  - Lowest Sep. 2021 (18,830)

#### WCCC is subsidized childcare, aged 0 to 12

- Budget displayed is (a) Base
   Subsidy + (b) <u>Tiered Reimbursement</u>
- Reimbursement rates are rebased to the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile of market (RCW 43.216.828)
- Rates vary by age category and region. Chart displays average.
- Licensed Family Homes rates are negotiated with SEIU 925
