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What has happened?: Changes since the 2024 Legislative Session

Changes:

TR revenue forecast updates.

Deficit Impacts*:

7 2yr: -\$441 M; 6yr: -\$1,239 M

TProject cost increases.

3 2yr: -\$439 M; 6yr: -\$1,531 M

TCulvert corrections.

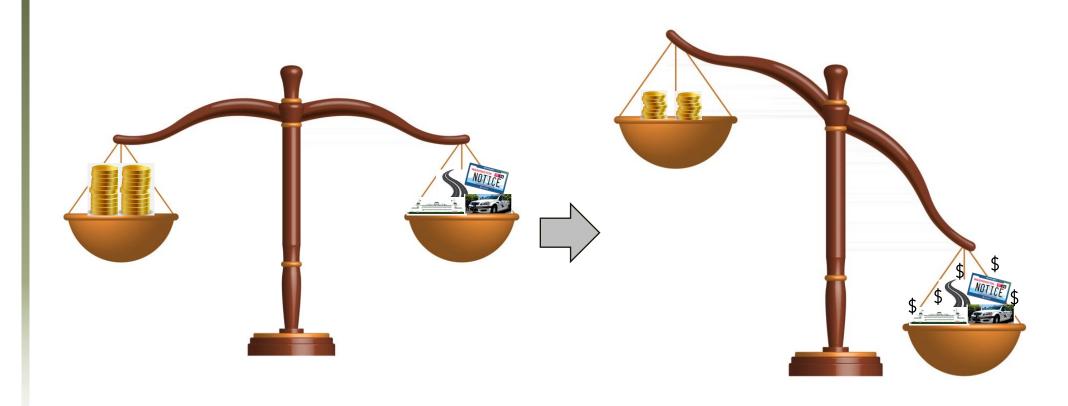
7 2yr: -\$68 M; 6yr: -\$1,840 M

TOTALOTTO

3 2yr: -719 M; 6yr: -2,163 M

Where does that leave things? A Budgetary/Financial Plan Shortfall

- **TOTAL** Gov Inslee's Budget/Financial Plan:
 - TACknowledges the forecast and known project cost changes only.
 - **7** 2-Year Budget is balanced by cutting \$1 billion from capital projects
 - **7**6-Year Financial Plan is -\$3 billion out of balance.
- Starting point for the Legislature:
 - TAddressing the Inslee project cuts and correcting for some errors.
 - **7** 2-Year deficit of -\$1 billion & 6-Year deficit of -\$4 billion.

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- TAdditional steps: Acknowledging culvert and other cost risks:
 - **7** 2-Year deficit of -\$1.8 billion & 6-Year deficit of -\$8 billion (cumulative).



What is the Path Forward? Ways to Address the Fiscal Shortfalls

- TOptions: reduce spending, increase resources, or a combo.
- TOne bookend: spending reductions only.
 - The large deficits mean that many projects, and perhaps the entire portfolio of budgetary programs, would likely be impacted.
- TOTAL OTHER DOOKENDS: additional resources only.
 - The large deficits would require significant tax and fee increases and/or getting funding from elsewhere.
- **T**Between bookends: some combination.
