



* NO NEW TAXES

Tax increases are not needed or wanted by the people. Because of a substantial up-turn in the state's economy, federal revenue sharing which will bring \$80-million to the State, and careful management and economy on the part of Republicans, this "ho!d the line" policy is possible.

SJR 1 would be the first step in limiting property taxes to present levels.

Some relief from the special levies on property to support public school can be found.



* PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

Public assistance is an integral part of our social concern for our fellow man. Wherever possible we want to eliminate abuses of the system and encourage personal initiative. Retraining and apprentice programs should be encouraged to remove employable persons from the welfare rolls.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION

The employer should have the option of carrying state insurance, private insurance, or self insurance.



* ACCENT ON AGRICULTURE

Agriculture is vital to the economy of the 16th District. When agriculture prospers the entire District prospers.

Improvements must continually be made on farm-to-market roads. Agricultural growth must not be hindered by oppressive methods of farm taxation. The rights of the farmer and the farm worker must be protected.

* PRISON REFORM

Reform within the walls of the prisons is essential. Reform should not, however, be synonymous with permissiveness. Carefully administered discipline encourages responsible action on the part of inmates. No law abiding citizen should be threatened by release programs which are inefficiently or carelessly administered.

The superintendents of our correctional institutions should be given discretionary authority within certain broad policies. More emphasis and consideration should be given to programs to guide and help first offenders rather than waiting until they become habitual criminals.

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

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about education

Jeannette says, "Education is the number one priority. It should be considered for inclusion in the state budget first and improvements in the quality of education must be made." After four years in the State House of Representatives, and an impressive record of service, to education as a school board chairman and member of the House Education Committee, Jeannette Hayner will also be a dedicated State Senator who has deep insight into the education issues. taxation

Jeannette Hayner on taxation, "Twice in six years, the people have rejected tax reform. Any plan that does not include constitutional limitations on the rate and types of taxes will be looked upon with suspicion by the voters."

justice

government

Honesty in Government: Hayner supports a code of ethics for legislators to define conflicts of interest and ethical codes. She feels strongly that the governor and lieutenant governor should be of the same party for continuity of leadership for the State.
